- Supporting its Carbon Literate staff and students whilst instilling and maintaining a low-carbon culture
- Positively utilising its influence in the community and wider world

Silver CLE



- The first Silver CLE with one of the highest certification rates, Barnsley College has adopted a comprehensive approach to Carbon Literacy, embedding it as a core element of its Sustainability Strategy.
- The college partnered with the local authority to develop training materials that students will deliver to the Barnsley community, promoting Carbon Literacy and equipping students with additional skills and job opportunities.

- The development of a Carbon Literacy course was written into UAL's institutional Climate Action Plan in 2022.
- Ran 42 Carbon Literacy courses in one academic year, reaching 500 staff and securing additional funding to continue to expand their training programme.
- UAL's goal is to give all its staff and students the opportunity to become Carbon Literate.





- New sustainable strategies identified through completion of Carbon Literacy training by senior management, directors and governors are beginning to be implemented.
- Senior staff are examining all procurement decisions against a carbon emissions framework, including food, travel, energy use and building design.
- Plan to increase the capacity of Carbon Literacy trainers and expand the reach of Carbon Literacy across the college.



- Aims to be a **leader** and **expert** in Carbon Literacy training as an educator "in a region that needs it".
- Plans to embed Carbon Literacy into Undergraduate and Postgraduate programmes, ensuring all graduates leave as Carbon Literate.



The University of Hull's Carbon Literacy programme has **inspired research projects** and helped reduce the university estate's **carbon footprint**.



Recent initiatives driven by CL include:

- * Green student reps on the student council
- Curriculum audits to embed green skills across sectors
- * Waste reduction through new solutions and a zero waste to landfill strategy
- Creation of a wildflower garden and introduction of beehives



City College Plymouth views Carbon Literacy as essential to achieving **net zero by 2050.**



- Carbon Literate staff and students have **applied their skills** in research, active travel, arts, food, health, and digital footprints.
- Supporting local schools in the West Midlands through the Climate Ambassadors programme.
- Aim to support the NHS by delivering Carbon Literacy training to healthcare students using the Carbon Literacy Healthcare Toolkit during their placements, equipping them to contribute to a Greener NHS.



200 people trained in over 18 months

61 staff & 67 students certified Carbon Literate





- Carbon Literacy is a "pivotal element" of the college's net zero plan, as it "integrates environmental consciousness into the fabric of the institution".
- 10% of staff have been trained so far, including the Principal, Chief Executive, and Estates Manager, increasing awareness and reducing energy use.
- All staff and students will be invited to undertake Carbon Literacy this academic year.



- Carbon Literacy training has been completed by a huge range of staff, not just academics.
- The university's goal is to certify as many staff and students as possible, predominantly through giving staff the confidence to deliver it to their students.
- Students have given feedback that Carbon Literacy has helped them to get their first graduate job.





Faculty of Business & Law

- 6 staff from Curtin's Faculty of Business and Law became certified Carbon Literate in 2022, embedding CL in the Faculty's 2023-2030 Strategic Plan.
- Worked with the University and Student Guild to turn pledges into actionable programs, such as Sustainable Event Guidelines and The Sustainable Collective.

Up to 71% of participants are 'extremely likely' to recommend Carbon Literacy training

Up to 100% of participants feel 'empowered to act' on climate after the training



- Carbon Literacy certification for students is now built into two Master's programmes.
- Aim to expand Carbon Literacy training for staff, students and businesses, as well as embed it as a core requirement in all new programmes.



Nearly **100 staff** from the College of Business, Law, and Social Sciences are now certified Carbon Literate.



- **30 staff trained**, with **100 more** set to complete the training.
- Pledges include reviewing cold storage, consolidating purchase orders to cut deliveries, reducing business travel, and offering plant-based catering for meetings.
- Aim to integrate Carbon Literacy into all curricula and train all staff and students, while working towards Silver CLE.

University of Bristol Medical School is the **first medical school** to achieve CLE accreditation.





- Carbon Literacy has bridged the gap between learning and practical action.
- Students have pledged impactful climate actions, from active travel and dietary changes to leading a solar PV project in Malawi, organising sports kit donation schemes, and coordinating sustainability for sports clubs.
- Some have even integrated Carbon Literacy into assessed work, such as creating a Scope 3 Carbon Action Plan for their university.



- The university chose Carbon Literacy as the "most rounded and influential climate change course" for its focus on action, after trialling various options.
- With four courses delivered, key staff, including the Chief Operating Officer and Director of Estates, have already participated, and several Heads of Department are organising training for their teams.
- They aim to train 30% of the university by 2028, but the course's popularity suggests they'll surpass this goal.





Recognising Carbon Literacy as a crucial tool to engage staff and students with its 2032 net zero goals, DMU has delivered training at their campuses in Leicester and at **overseas campuses** in **Kazakhstan** and **Dubai** and to its Trans National Educational (TNE) partners in **Denmark, India, Sri Lanka and Malaysia.**

- As part of its civic leadership, DMU also collaborates with local partners to deliver Carbon Literacy across Leicester, ensuring a united citywide effort to tackle climate change.
- In the coming year, DMU plans to integrate Carbon Literacy into its new London campus and continue training across its **TNE partners**.
