Carbon Literacy® training is a proven and reliable tool for **delivering action** to cut carbon emissions and improve the **health and prosperity** of our communities in the process.

Carbon Literacy is **for everyone**, but access to training varies globally due to relative spending power.

Our Community Pot aims to **improve access** to Carbon Literacy training for those who might otherwise **struggle to afford** the costs associated with initiating training.

The Community Pot has been created with **contributions from organisations** that have paid **enhanced rates** for Carbon Literacy Certificate Applications.

This round provided the equivalent of **£12,150** in funded services to **7** not-for-profit organisations working closely with Black, Asian & Ethnic Minority groups across the United Kingdom.
