Carbon Literacy offers a unique and flexible framework for a day's worth of highly relevant climate change learning. With large-scale take-up across the UK and Europe, over 140,000 learners have now been certified as Carbon Literate.

Carbon Literacy learning and certification covers the essentials of climate change, carbon footprints, how an individual can 'do their bit', and why it is relevant from an individual to an organisational level.

Carbon Literacy is aimed at three distinct audiences – those who live, those who work, and those who study. As the certification body, this enables The Carbon Literacy Project (CLP) to capture all audiences, aiming to offer every citizen Carbon Literacy training. As the certification body, we directly advocate for the delivery and uptake of Carbon Literacy training, support organisations, trainers and individuals to do so, and actively work to create low-carbon culture change.

Role Description:

As a Project Advocate, it will be your role to assist and advise organisations on their journey to become Carbon Literate. You will work directly with a whole host of different organisations as the designated point of contact, managing their on-boarding experience. You will account manage many organisations at one time, all of whom have different client needs. For example, which course they should use (whether it's a pre-accredited course, or writing one from scratch), who they should train (from leadership to more junior members of staff), and their organisational objectives relating to staff engagement and decarbonisation. By applying a consultative approach, you will understand the organisation's objectives, the barriers to take-up, and what their Carbon Literacy rollout could look like. By combining your passion for customer experience with a comprehensive knowledge of Carbon Literacy, you will propose the right path for these organisations.

Responsibilities and Duties:

CL: Carbon Literacy

- Directly advise and support organisations in rolling out CL. The role will involve proactively dealing with leads and enquiries from interested organisations and networks.
- Pitch CL to these organisations and advise them on how they can engage with the training.
- Support organisations with course development.
- Maintain good relationships with organisations. Periodically 'check in' with them, encourage them to work towards gaining Carbon Literate Organisation (CLO) status.
- Advocate for CL via online and physical events, and to initiate interest where it is not already present.
- Set up and support existing training providers.
- Identify and encourage collaborations with partners where appropriate.
- Maintain meticulous tracking and management of leads (via salesforce).
