What is a Toolkit?

Toolkit materials are kept up to date either by **The Carbon Literacy Project** or by **sectoral experts** working closely with The Project.


As a result, 'reinvention of the wheel' is avoided, and the expertise and experience of many are brought together, to deliver more **effective training** and **better outcomes**.

Slide deck

The Toolkit includes a **full slide deck** with **customisable slides**, **activities**, and **slide notes** which can act as a script for the training. The trainer can also add their own notes and will be required to edit the customisable slides in the slide deck to make the learning relevant to their audience.



What role do community leaders have? 1. Leading by example 2. Shaping action using local knowledge and lived experience 3. Ensuring climate action is just and inclusive, and that marginalised voices are represented 4. Using our position as trusted messengers to communicate climate change 5. Enabling practical action by local people 6. Building connections between different people and campaigns

Blue-bordered slides

In order for the Carbon Literacy training to maintain **locally & socially relevant** to the learners in the room, the trainer(s) should **modify** some of the slides. These slides are easily identified by their **blue border**.

Activity: Impacts on our Communities



In your groups, discuss the impacts on our communities.

For example, these could be impacts on our finances, infrastructure, health, or well-being.

Activity: Your best idea for community engagement



- Discuss within your group initiatives to engage your local community in reducing carbon emissions.
- Choose your best initiative to pitch back: Dragons' Den style to the rest
 of the group.

Activities

During the course, learners should be encouraged to come up with their **own solutions** through **group discussion**. Activities provide an opportunity for this to happen.

The Toolkit includes a variety of **activities** to share with learners to **encourage engagement**, and the slide notes provide the trainer with information on how to explain and facilitate each activity.



Slide notes

The slide notes accompanying each slide can be used either as a **script** to deliver the content, or as a **guide for trainers** to use to help them deliver the content in their **own style**. All references, resources, and image copyright for the content featured in each slide can be found in the slide notes for the trainer to refer to throughout the session.


The slide animations and slide notes should be adjusted to suit the trainers delivery style, however, the **core content of each slide should remain the same**.
