

West Suffolk College (WSC) has embedded Carbon Literacy training across its curriculum, leadership, and wider community, creating a culture of climate action. The college's proactive approach has influenced culture change and sustainability practices both internally and externally, earning them recognition and awards for environmental leadership and Bronze Carbon Literate Educator status.



Creating a culture of climate action

Starting with a desire to align with national policy in 2022 and become a 'Carbon Literacy' centre, West Suffolk College moved from externally supported training to internal delivery, embedding Carbon Literacy and climate action across leadership, curriculum, and operations.

Building confidence & capacity to deliver Carbon Literacy



- Partnered with Groundwork East for initial training.
- Key staff attended Delivering Successful Carbon Literacy sessions and then Groundwork East's **Train-the-Trainer course**.
- In-house training using the Carbon Literacy Further Education
 Toolkit, expanding delivery across vocational areas on the 16-19
 programmes as well as to Sustainability Student Ambassadors,
 staff, leadership team and local community.
- Staff experienced in Carbon Literacy delivery gained Carbon Literacy Facilitator (CLF) status, preparing to apply for Carbon Literacy Trainer (CLT) status.
- Developed an accredited online Carbon Literacy course for apprentices.

Empowering students to become sustainability leaders

- 100% Carbon Literacy certification among Student Sustainability Ambassadors.
- Group actions empowered students to lead carbon reduction initiatives and awareness-raising campaigns, including clear signage at recycling stations, researching alternative food services, and attending Youth Climate Conferences and 'Students Operating Sustainably' events.

Scaling its reach across departments and into the community has transformed WSC from a participant in climate education to a regional leader and shaper of national sustainable education policy.


Engaging local employers
